This award is in memory of Ann Thompson who was a highly respected piano teacher in Canberra for many years, Some of her former students sponsor this ongoing award for students who show potential in their early years of learning.

The late Doris Rowland Excellence Award –18 years and under Sections - \$100

This award is in the memory of the much loved and former Director of the Piano Eisteddfod, the late Doris Rowland OAM. The special award will be made at the adjudicator's discretion. To qualify for the award, competitors must enter for, and play in, at least two sections 181, 182, 183, 184, 185, 186 and 187.

Restricted Sections for Canberra based students, Sections P084, P104 and P123.

The section will be Own Choice for students who reside and study in Canberra and who have not won a First Place in the Australian National Eisteddfod.

Special Notices

7-12 years sections -Trophy and a cash prize for first place, medals for all second and third placegetters.

Medals and Cash prize for all placegetters in sections 13 – 18 years.

Please note – Trophies in place of a cash prize may be available for the sections 13 – 15 years. please see Event Director (Di Miley).

A copy of the music must be provided at least 15 minutes prior to the commencement of the section entered.

Music is to be placed in the appropriate tray with details noted by the entrant or entrant's representative on the section registration sheet which will be in the tray.

The competitor number (as listed in the program), title and composer of the selected piece must be written at the top of the copy of the music.

All sections including the Final of the Open Sections (Piano Championship) will be held at the Wesley Music Centre

All Open sections (Piano Championship) will be held on Sunday 25 August 2024

Photography will only be permitted by the parents of the performer or by agreement with the Event Director.

Piano Solo means performance on a piano by a single performer. Piano Duet means performance by two people on a single instrument.

Only one piece of music per performance – a combination of pieces to complete the time limit is not permitted. Exception is the Preliminary Round (part of the Open Piano Championship).

No entrant may render the same item in more than one section of the Eisteddfod and,

No entrant, having won a section, may render the same item in the following year.

No entrant having won the Piano Championship may enter in the Piano Championship in following years.

"Restricted" means that the section is open to those who have never won a first place in any Piano Solo section in any previous Australian National Eisteddfod.

Repeats are optional.

Time limits must be observed. See General Rules and Conditions of Entry No.22.

Please observe Copyright Law as set out below.

Entrants should pay particular attention to neatness of appearance when appearing on stage, as this may be taken into consideration by the Adjudicator.

Numbering of sections

The first two digits indicate the upper age for that section.

Exceptions are the AMEB sections where entry to the section will be at highest grade completed.

Open sections are indicated by "00".

Prizes

Trophies and a cash prize will be awarded for first place in the 7 - 12 year sections.

Second and third place getters in the 7 - 12 year sections will receive a medal.

Cash prize and a Medal for all placegetters in all 13 - 18 year sections.

All participants will receive written feedback from the adjudicator. Please collect completed adjudicator forms from the table outside the performance hall.

Copyright

The Australian National Eisteddfod Society Inc. (ANES) holds an Australian Performing Rights Association (APRA)/One Music Australia licence that covers the public performance of all copyright musical works at this event. The licence fee is based on a per entry rate. The fee for 2024 is \$1.45 and is included in the Piano Eisteddfod entry fee.

Association of Eisteddfod Societies of Australia (ASEA)has an arrangement with the Australian Mechanical Copyright Owners Society (AMCOS) that allows entrants to photocopy an original piece of sheet music for adjudicators.

Entrants must perform from original published editions of music unless prior permission has been obtained from the copyright owner.

ADJUDICATORS

Dr Paul Rickard-Ford - Sydney Conservatorium of Music

After completing his BMus at the Melbourne Conservatorium, Paul Rickard-Ford was awarded the Clarke Scholarship to undertake postgraduate studies at the Royal College of Music, London where he gained the ARCM and the Dannreuther Prize for the most outstanding concerto performance.

In recent years he has been a frequent performer on ABC Classic FM and has recorded Liszt's complete "Annees de Pelerinage", 2 all Schumann recitals, an all Chopin recital and several "Sunday Live" programs, all of which were broadcast nationally.

In 2008 he was appointed as a Federal Examiner for the AMEB. He tours Asia annually and regularly visits Malaysia, Taiwan, Singapore, Guangzhou, Shanghai, Beijing, Seoul and Hong Kong giving masterclasses for the Sydney Conservatorium of Music.

His students and former students have achieved outstanding success in local, national and international competitions. In both the 2012 and 2016 Sydney International Piano Competitions his students were awarded Best Australian Pianist. He is a pioneer in the field of professional development for piano teachers and is in demand as a guest lecturer at pedagogy conferences throughout Australia.

Katherine Austin – University of Waikato Conservatorium of Music

Head of Piano Studies for the University of Waikato Conservatorium of Music, Katherine Austin is one of New Zealand's leading pianists and performs regularly around New Zealand and overseas, touring frequently for Chamber Music New Zealand, and broadcasting regularly on Radio New Zealand Concert.

Katherine graduated Master of Music with First Class Honours in Piano Performance from Auckland University, under teachers Janetta McStay and Bryan Sayer Katherine has performed Romantic piano concerto repertoire with the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra and the Auckland Philharmonic Orchestra and has been guest on a number of occasions as concerto soloist with the Auckland Chamber Orchestra and Opus Orchestra, specialising in the concertos of Mozart and Beethoven

From their piano studies at the University of Waikato, Katherine's students have excelled, winning scholarships to study in Germany, Vienna, London, and at the Australian National Academy of Music.

The Open Piano Championship Final (now P005) will consist of a Preliminary Round and a Final Round. Four contestants will be selected from the Preliminary Round to perform in the Final Round – the Open Piano Championship.

Previous entrants awarded First Place in the Open Piano Championship (formerly P001) are not eligible to enter.

The Prizes for the 2024 Open Piano Championship are,

First place - \$5,000 Second Place - \$2,000 Third Place - \$1,000

To enter P005, Open Piano Championship, entrants will be required to perform in at least two other Open Piano Solo sections (P001, P002 or P004) as well as the Preliminary Round.

A Prize has been established in the Open Sacred Section of the Singing Division of the Eisteddfod in her Memory.

General rules and conditions of entry

All entrants participate according to these rules and conditions and any special conditions as may apply to individual divisions or events.

GENERAL

- 1. Entries must be submitted in the Stardom system (<u>http://www.stardom.com.au</u>) and accompanied by full fees or they will not be processed. Responsibility for correct entry rests with the entrant.
- The Eisteddfod reserves the right to: (a) refuse an entry;
 - (b) cancel a section (e.g. due to lack of entries);
 - (c) vary the prizes (e.g. when insufficient entries perform);
 - (d) demand proof of age of an entrant in an age section, or proof of amateur or professional status, or
 - (e) combine sections together.
- 3. An entrant may only enter a particular section once, except where specifically stated otherwise. The name of the partner(s) in a duo, lieder or ensemble must be included on the entry form, except for bands, orchestras, choirs and ensembles of six or more players.
- 4. No person may enter under a name other than his or her own. Entries are not transferable from one person to another.
- 5. Refunds of entry fees will be made to an entrant only if a section has been cancelled by the Eisteddfod.
- 6. One conductor may conduct any number of groups, and one director may present any number of groups. Age limits do not apply to conductors.
- 7. Entrants at Eisteddfod functions take part at their own risk. The Society does not accept responsibility for any accident or personal loss or injury, however caused.
- 8. Prizes, reports and original material not collected at the conclusion of the relevant division will be available for collection by arrangement with an Event Director.
- 9. Age, where specified for any section, shall be the age on the first day of competition of the division in which the entry is made.
- 10. Any entrant wishing to withdraw from a section must notify the Eisteddfod as soon as possible.
- 11. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Eisteddfod.
- 12. The Australian National Eisteddfod Society will not be liable for any copyright infringement relating to the submission of photocopies. Entrants should be aware of the rules of copyright (see section 30 headed `Copyright' below).
- 13. The Society reserves the right to record, film, broadcast, telecast, videotape or photograph any entrant, item or event in the Eisteddfod without notification, unless the entrant advises the Eisteddfod in advance their photo is not to be shared. Any such photograph, recording or broadcast may be used at the Eisteddfod's discretion for publicity or promotional purposes, but shall not necessarily constitute an endorsement of any entrants, and no remuneration or compensation whatsoever shall be attributable to any entrants so featured.
- Recording of performances on video is not permitted. Photography is permitted so long as a flash is not used.
 A high standard of behaviour is expected from all entrants and spectators. Participants and supporters must
- comply with the Code of Conduct.16. Any mechanical rights which should be obtained in respect of recordings for performance is the responsibility of the performer. The Eisteddfod holds a licence issued by APRA for the live performance of published music.
- An entrant, who during the three months preceding the opening date of the division in which he or she has entered, has been taught, coached or advised by the appointed Adjudicator of the division, shall not be eligible to compete in that division of the Eisteddfod.
- 18. Failure to comply with any of the foregoing rules and conditions may result in disqualification and withholding of prizes. The decision of the Eisteddfod in all questions or disputes arising out of, or not provided for, by these rules and regulations shall be final. All entries are received on this condition and in the spirit of friendly competition upon which the Australian National Eisteddfod is based, and no dispute shall become the subject of any appeal at law.

PERFORMANCE

- 19. Entrants should pay particular attention to neatness of appearance when appearing on stage, as this may be taken into consideration by the Adjudicator.
- 20. (a) No entrant may render the same item in more than one section of the Eisteddfod except where otherwise specified.

(b) No entrant, having won a section, may render the same item in the following year.

- 21. A copy of the music or other material to be performed in "own choice" events MUST be provided for the Adjudicator and Accompanist, unless it is a piece set by the Eisteddfod. The onus of choosing the right material for the event rests with the entrant. Suitability and degree of difficulty will be taken into consideration by the Adjudicator. The Eisteddfod does not accept responsibility for the loss of music or other material. In accordance with Copyright law, photocopies and other texts will be destroyed following the event.
- 22. Time limits set out in the Syllabus must be adhered to. Entrants who exceed the time limit may have marks deducted or be disqualified by the Adjudicator.
- 23. A teacher shall not be allowed on stage except in the capacity of an official, accompanist or conductor.
- 24. Prompting or assistance of any kind shall not be given to any entrant, except by the Adjudicator, who may take any contravention of this Rule into consideration in his or her adjudication.
- 25. Communication with the Adjudicator by entrants, teachers or other interested parties (other than in an official capacity) during a section is strictly prohibited, and the Eisteddfod reserves the right to disqualify an entrant for any breach of this rule.
- 26. The Adjudicator's decision shall be final.
- 27. Any protest shall be made in writing to the Eisteddfod within 24 hours of the completion of the relevant section. A protest can only be made by an entrant, or the entrant's teacher or parent. The decision of the Eisteddfod shall be final.
- 28. A copy of the Adjudicator's report will be made available free of charge at the end of each section.
- 29. Entrants shall not practise in the performing space for their division on the division's competition days.

PRIZES`

30. The Eisteddfod comprises competitive and non-competitive sections. The prize or award for each section is outlined in the relevant Syllabus and Stardom section description. All prizes, including highly commended, are at the discretion of the Adjudicator. In exceptional circumstances the adjudicator may award a prize jointly to more than 1 competitor with a total monetary value not exceeding the specified prize amount.

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- 31. The Australian National Eisteddfod Society Inc. holds an Australian Performing Rights Association (APRA) licence. An entrant may supply the adjudicator with an unlicensed copy of the piece providing that (a) the original is used by the entrant for the performance or held at the venue for inspection and (b) the Eisteddfod or its delegate destroys the copy immediately after the event.
